What is Mitzvah Day?

On Mitzvah Day we can all make a positive difference to the world in which we live by giving our most valuable possession — our time.

Mitzvah Day is a Jewish led day of social action that brings thousands of people together of all faiths and none, and all ages, to give their time, NOT their money, to make a difference to the local community around them, on Mitzvah Day, (this vear November 27th) and throughout the year.

Partners running a Mitzvah Day include office groups, young professionals, schools, mother and baby groups, university students, youth movements, synagogues and interfaith groups.

We are growing internationally. Mitzvah Day 2015 had projects running in 21 different countries across 4 continents. In Germany and Australia

Mitzvah Day is run nationally, a model that will, in 2016, be emulated in Poland and Belgium.

In the UK, where Mitzvah Day began, it is also the largest multi-faith day of social action and provides an amazing opportunity to strengthen relationships. In 2015 over 70 Interfaith Mitzvah Days took place, and Mitzvah Day is proud to partner with Interfaith Week, and all faith groups to carry out hands-on social action, side-by-side.

Mitzvah Day is confident, Jewish and outward facing, based on our willingness to reach out to neighbours and to make the communities around us better places to live.
