Mitzvah Day is a Jewish led day of social action that brings thousands of people together of all faiths and none, and all ages, to give their time, NOT their money, to make a difference to the local community around them, on Mitzvah Day, (this year November 18th) and throughout the year.

Partners running a Mitzvah Day include office groups, young professionals, schools, mother and baby groups, university students, youth movements, synagogues and Interfaith groups.

Some of the projects undertaken on Mitzvah Day are: bringing sunshine to seniors, putting on your wellies and engaging in environmental

projects, Mitzvah Day shopping to replenish food bank stores, cooking for the homeless, Mitzvah Day Collectathons, Makeovers of rooms and spaces for charities and much, much more building genuine connections between local communities and charities.

Mitzvah Day is the largest multi-faith day of social action in the UK. In 2017, over 100 Interfaith Mitzvah Days took place and Mitzvah Day is proud to partner with Interfaith Week and all faith groups to carry out hands-on social action, side-by-side.
